### Attendance and Punctuality – Important

- We would like to remind parents that **holiday in term time is not allowed under Government regulations for school attendance**. Pupils have 175 days off school each year and there is an expectation that holiday will be booked in these periods. The impact of taking time off is significant for pupils of all ages. Any term time holiday it will be recorded as unauthorised absence and will make it difficult for your child to stay above the 90% that is needed before external agencies/legal processes start to become involved. Please do not book any unauthorised holidays without speaking to the Head Teacher.
- Attendance parents meetings will be held this term with all parents whose children have punctuality concerns or whose absence is below 90% and therefore classed as being persistent.
